The Department of Agriculture for Scotland hereby give notice that in exercise of their powers under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, they have made the Importation of Raw Cherries (Scotland) Order of 1930 regulating the importation of raw cherries into Scotland during the 1930 season.

Cherries grown in France will be admitted without restrictions until the 3rd June, after which date those grown in the Southern Zone will be prohibited. Cherries from the Central Zone will be admitted until the 9th June, and those grown in the Northern Departments until the 6th July, after which date the importation of French cherries will be prohibited except of those grown within a small district around Honfleur. Details of the various Zones are given in the Order.

Cherries grown in Italy will be admitted without restrictions until the 5th June, after which date only those grown in the Region of Emilia will be admitted; after the 16th June the importation of cherries grown in any part of Italy will be entirely prohibited.

Certificates of Origin must accompany cherries grown in any other European country which are imported after the 5th June.

The Order remains in force until 30th September 1930.

POST OFFICE TELEPHONES.

In pursuance of the Telephone Regulations, 1924, His Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the charges for telephonic communication between Great Britain (excluding the Isle of Man) on the one hand and the Island of Java in the Dutch East Indies on the other are £5 2s. 0d. for a call of not more than 3 minutes' duration, and £1 14s. 0d. for each additional minute or fraction of a minute in excess of 3 minutes.

NOTE.—Communication is at present limited

in Java to calls to certain selected call offices in the following places:—

Bandoeng, Buitenzorg, Cheribon, Djok-jakarta, Kediri, Malang, Semarang, Soekaboemi, Soerabaja, Solo (Soerakarta), Tjepoe, Weltevreden.

The hours during which calls may be made vary according to the season, but at present calls may be made only between the hours of 1.40 p.m. and 5.10 p.m. (British Summer Time). The service is not open on Sundays or public holidays or on the anniversaries of the birthdays of the Dutch Royal Family (the 19th and 30th April and the 2nd and 31st of August).

Calls may be booked only for a specified person, and as subscribers in Java have to be called to a special public call office in order to receive calls from this country, subscribers in this country, when booking a call to Java,

should give the usual postal address of the person required, in addition to his name and telephone number.

If the person required (or an acceptable substitute) is not available or does not wish to speak or if he fails to arrive at the call office at the appointed time a "Report Charge" of £1 6s. 0d. is payable.
