TOY MANUFACTURING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

FIXING OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

The Toy Manufacturing Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued a Notice, dated 30th May 1930, setting out Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers as fixed by the Trade Board and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour, to take effect as from 1st September 1930, together with the Minimum Rates which were previously in operation.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for the situations of Typist and Clerk-Typist in Departments of the Civil Service will be held in Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Leeds, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne and Portsmouth, commencing on the 30th September 1930, under the Regulations dated the 11th November 1927, and published in the Edinburgh Gazette of the 15th November 1927.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received on or before the 24th July 1930 an application in the Candidate's own handwriting, on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

The Department of Agriculture for Scotland hereby give notice that in exercise of their powers under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, they have made the Importation of Raw Cherries (Scotland) Order of 1930 regulating the importation of raw cherries into Scotland during the 1930 season.

Cherries grown in France will be admitted without restrictions until the 3rd June, after which date those grown in the Southern Zone will be prohibited. Cherries from the Central Zone will be admitted until the 9th June, and those grown in the Northern Departments until the 6th July, after which date the importation of French cherries will be prohibited except of those grown within a small district around Honfleur. Details of the various Zones are given in the Order.

Cherries grown in Italy will be admitted without restrictions until the 5th June, after which date only those grown in the Region of Emilia will be admitted; after the 16th June the importation of cherries grown in any part of Italy will be entirely prohibited.

Certificates of Origin must accompany cherries grown in any other European country which are imported after the 5th June.

The Order remains in force until 30th September 1930.

POST OFFICE TELEPHONES.

In pursuance of the Telephone Regulations, 1924, His Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the charges for telephonic communication between Great Britain (excluding the Isle of Man) on the one hand and the Island of Java in the Dutch East Indies on the other are £5 2s. 0d. for a call of not more than 3 minutes' duration, and £1 14s. 0d. for each additional minute or fraction of a minute in excess of 3 minutes.
