REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

HOLLOW-WARE.

With reference to the Notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 15th November 1929, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of imported wrought enamelled hollow-ware whether of iron or steel for domestic (including hospital) use, the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section 7, that a Report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid description of goods.
