LANARKSHIRE TRACTION COMPANY  
(TRAMWAYS ABANDONMENT).  
ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF  
TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS it is enacted in Section 6 of the Lanarkshire Traction Order, 1929 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1929"), as follows:—

"(1) Where on any application made to him by the Company the Minister is satisfied—

(a) that it is just and expedient that an Order should be made under the provisions of this Section having regard to the financial results of working the Company's tramways or any part thereof in respect of which the application has been made, and to any other relevant circumstances, and

(b) that the requirements of public traffic on the routes of the Company's tramways or such part thereof are or can be adequately met by services of omnibuses;

the Minister may by Order authorise the abandonment of the whole or any part of the tramways referred to in the application."

And whereas it is enacted by Section 3 of the Order of 1929 that "the Company" means the Lanarkshire Traction Company, and that "the Minister" means the Minister of Transport.

And whereas the Lanarkshire Traction Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") have made application to the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") under Section 6 of the

Order of 1929 for an Order authorising the abandonment by them of the tramways described in the Schedule hereto.

And whereas, pursuant to sub-section (2) of the said Section 6 of the Order of 1929, the Minister has required the Company to give such public and other notices of the said application as are therein prescribed, and no representations have been made to the Minister in pursuance of the provisions of the said sub-section.

And whereas the Minister is satisfied—

- (a) that it is just and expedient that an Order should be made under the provisions of the said Section 6 of the Order of 1929; and
- (b) that the requirements of public traffic on the routes of the said tramways can be adequately met by services of omnibuses.

Now, therefore, the Minister in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 6 of the Order of 1929, and of any and every other power thereunto him enabling, hereby orders as follows:—

- (1) The Minister authorises the abandonment of the said tramways, and in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of the said Section 6 prescribes that the sixth day of October 1930 shall be the date as from which the abandonment shall take effect.
- (2) This Order may be cited as the Lanarkshire Traction Company (Tramways Abandonment) Order, 1930.

The tramways in the foregoing Order referred to are—

- (1) The tramway enumerated and described in Section 6 of the Hamilton, Motherwell, and Wishaw Tramways Act, 1900, except that portion of the tramway between Motherwell Cross and the Company's Power House in the Burgh of Motherwell and Wishaw, and
- (2) The tramways enumerated and described in Section 5 of the Lanarkshire Tramways Order, 1903, as Tramways Nos. 1, 2, 3B, 4, 9, 10, and 11.
