

through the fall about 18 inches square and about 4 yards long. Hawthorn then crawled halfway through the tunnel and pulled both Collins and Taylor through the opening. Immediately after Taylor had been extricated, another extensive fall occurred and closed the tunnel completely.

Hawthorn displayed conspicuous gallantry in effecting single handed the rescue of these two men. He incurred great personal risk as he was working in an open cavity from which stones were falling the whole time and there was always the danger that another large fall might occur before the rescue operations were completed.

VARIATION AND CANCELLATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THE RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE IN SCOTLAND.

Notice is further given that Accounts and Statements relative to such Review have been lodged with the Tribunal. Any Railway Company to which the said Scheme applies or Representative Body of Traders interested, which may be desirous of being heard before the Tribunal on the Review must file a notice of such desire at the Office of the Registrar, 2 Clement's Inn, Strand, London, W.C.2, on or before the 12th day of November 1930.

Such notice must be on foolscap size paper, and must state concisely the Submission (if any) which is desired to be made, and in the case of a Representative Body of Traders, must in addition contain a statement of the facts upon which such Body claims to represent a substantial number of persons interested in any or all of the selected traffics.

Each notice filed must be stamped with an adhesive fee stamp for 2s. 6d. (which can only be purchased at the Office of the Tribunal). If sent by post each notice must be accompanied by a Postal Order for 2s. 6d. payable to the Registrar, Railway Rates Tribunal, when a stamp will be affixed at the Office. Five additional copies of each notice must be lodged with the original at the Office of the Registrar.
