PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of December, 1930 (C.W. 6108/30), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing dated the 11th day of February 1913, to provide, *inter alia*, for the grant of combatant commissions, as Lieutenant, Royal Marines, at our discretion, to any Warrant Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer or man who may perform some specially meritorious service or distinguished War Service:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing

date the 28th day of March 1930, to provide for a reduction in the age of retirement from 55 to 50 for Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Warrant Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who were especially promoted to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant on account of acts of gallantry or daring in the Service, and also for their exemption from passing any qualifying examination for promotion to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant-Commander:

“And whereas we are of opinion that similar conditions should be attached to the grant of commissions in future as Lieutenant, Royal Marines, under clause 7 of Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February 1913:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following regulations:—

(i) The age for compulsory retirement of Officers specially promoted who in future obtain commissions in the Royal Marines under the provisions of clause 7 of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February 1913, to be 50 years, unless then holding a rank or appointment in respect of which the age for compulsory retirement in the case of direct entry Officers exceeds 50 years, when such higher age limit shall be applicable to them.

(ii) These Officers to be exempted from passing such examinations as may be re-

quired to qualify direct entry Officers for promotion to higher rank."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

On the occasion of a bad accident that occurred on board H.M.S. "Hood" at Portsmouth on the 15th February 1930, when Dockyard workmen were engaged in opening up for inspection the starboard after bulge compartments, a Shipwright named Langford entered through the manhole into a compartment contaminated with carbon monoxide and was overcome and collapsed. He was alive when brought out but died without recovering consciousness.

As soon as the alarm was given a rescue party entered the bulge, but found great difficulty in locating Langford owing to the very bad atmosphere and the absence of effective lighting. The party had gas-masks but these were ineffective against carbon monoxide gas. Notwithstanding these difficulties, however, Able Seaman Harrison made his way through successive compartments and at great personal risk, continued his search and, with assistance, eventually brought Langford out. On being brought out, Harrison himself was in a state of collapse.
