REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

ELECTRICITY METERS AND PARTS THEREOF.

With reference to the Notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh, and Belfast Gazettes of the 25th July 1930, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of imported goods of the following classes and descriptions:—

- (a) Electricity meters which register by integration over a period of time the consumption, or quantity of electricity used, in any electric circuit; and
- (b) the following parts of such meters, viz., the case, the rotor, the shunt system and the series system,

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

The Department of Agriculture for Scotland hereby give notice that, in exercise of their powers under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, they have made the

Northern Ireland Potatoes Importation (Scotland) Order, 1930.

This Order, which comes into force on 1st February 1931, supersedes the Irish Potatoes Importation (Scotland) Order, 1925, so far as the latter relates to Northern Ireland. Its main provision is that, except under the conditions of a licence granted by the Department, no potatoes grown in Northern Ireland may be brought into Scotland unless they are accompanied by a certificate issued by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland to the effect (1) that the land on which the potatoes were

grown is not situated within a district which has been placed under control by the Ministry for Northern Ireland for the purposes of preventing the spread of Wart Disease, or, if the land on which the potatoes were grown is situated within such a district, that the potatoes are of a variety approved by the Department as immune from Wart Disease, and (2) that Wart Disease has not occurred on or within one mile of such land.
