PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Aliens Order, 1920, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, made in pursuance of the Aliens Restriction Acts, 1914 and 1919, His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to impose certain restrictions on aliens, and to make provisions in accordance with the said Acts for giving effect to the said Order:

And whereas by the Expiring Laws Continuance Act, 1930, Section 1 of the Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Act, 1919, was continued until 31st December 1931:

And whereas His Majesty has power by Order in Council to revoke alter or add to any Order in Council made under the said Acts:

And whereas the principal Order was amended by Orders in Council dated 3rd December 1920, the 12th March 1923, and 24th July 1925:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the principal Order, as amended, should be further amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas on account of urgency this Order should come into immediate operation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The principal Order shall be amended as follows:—

- (1) For the words "he is not a lunatic, idiot, or mentally deficient" in sub-section (3) (c) of Article 1, there shall be substituted the words

"he is not a person of unsound mind or a mentally defective person."—
20 & 21 Geo. V. c. 23, sect. 20 (5)
17 & 18 Geo. V. c. 33, sect. 1.

- (2) For the words "add such conditions . . . added. An Alien who fails to comply with any condition so attached or added" in sub-section (4) of Article 1 there shall be substituted the words

"vary such conditions in such manner as he thinks fit and the alien shall comply with the conditions so attached or varied. An alien who fails to comply with any conditions so attached or varied,"

and the following paragraph shall be added at the end of sub-section (4)

"where a condition limiting the period during which an alien may remain in the United Kingdom has been attached to the grant of leave to the alien to land in the United Kingdom or has been imposed by way of varia-

tion of any condition so attached, the condition so attached or varied shall remain in force notwithstanding that within the period so limited the alien has entered the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands."

- (3) The following sub-section shall be substituted for sub-section (2) of Article 3:

"For the purpose of such inspection an alien may land temporarily and provided he submits himself forthwith to such inspection shall be deemed not to have landed. Any such alien may be detained in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct and while so detained shall be deemed to be in legal custody."

- (4) For the words "until dealt with under this Order be detained in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct" in sub-section (3) of Article 3, there shall be substituted the words

"notwithstanding any intervening prosecution be detained in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct, until dealt with under sub-section (5) of this Article, or otherwise in accordance with the provisions of this Order."

- (5) In sub-sections (1) (d) and (5) of Article 6 the word "three" shall be substituted for the word "two."
- (6) In sub-section (6) (b) (i.) of Article 12 the words "poor relief" shall be substituted for the words "parochial relief."
- (7) In sub-section (4) of Article 18 omit paragraph (a) and reletter the remaining paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d).
- (8) In sub-section (1) of Article 23 the words "Department of Health for Scotland" shall be substituted for the words "Scottish Board of Health."

This Order shall come into operation forthwith as a provisional order in accordance with Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 3rd July 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 6th July 1931 to Saturday the 11th July 1931 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an amended application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

- (1) Toys;
- (2) Requisites (except clothing and footwear) for indoor or outdoor sports and games including table and parlour games, but not including yachting, rowing and sculling, swimming, ice-skating, hunting, fishing, shooting, horse and dog racing, motor-boating, motoring, motor-cycling and cycling, gliding and aeroplaning;
- (3) Gymnastic and athletic requisites;
- (4) (i.) Frames for racquets (tennis, badminton and other);
- (ii.) Heads for golf clubs;
- (iii.) Leather cases for footballs, punch balls, water polo balls, net balls and medicine balls;
- (iv.) Wood blades for "ski."

The reference previously made to the Standing Committee in respect of imported toys and games (other than sports requisites) is annulled.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

MENT ORDER OF 1931 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of the Great Britain (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Regulation of Movement Order of 1931 in respect of the County of Orkney.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 1 of the Great Britain (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Regulation of Movement Order of 1931, hereinafter referred to as "the

principal Order," a licence shall not be required for the movement of an animal by road, railway or water within the area described in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Articles 2 and 4 of the principal Order shall cease to apply to the area described in the Schedule hereto.

Movement into Scheduled Area.

2. The movement of any animal into the area described in the Schedule hereto from any other part of Great Britain is hereby prohibited.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall take effect on the twenty-fifth day of June nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the GREAT BRITAIN (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) REGULATION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1931 (No. 2) and shall be read with the principal Order.

1931 (No. 21) and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 1 of the Great Britain (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Regulation of Movement Order of 1931, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," a licence shall not be required for the movement of an animal by road, railway or water within any of the areas described in the Schedule hereto, or by water between any of such areas.

(2) Articles 2 and 4 of the principal Order shall cease to apply to the areas described in the Schedule hereto.

Movement into Scheduled Areas.

2. The movement of any animal into any of the areas described in the Schedule hereto from any other part of Great Britain not included in such areas is hereby prohibited.

Revocation.

3. The Great Britain (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Regulation of Movement Order of 1931 (No. 2) is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall take effect on the twenty-sixth day of June nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the GREAT BRITAIN (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) REGULATION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1931 (No. 3) and shall be read with the principal Order.
