MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

IMPORTED BUTTER.

A Draft of an Order in Council under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, to require imported butter (including blends of butter consisting of or containing imported butter) to be marked with an indication of origin, has been laid before Parliament as required by Section 7 of the Act.
