TOWN COUNCIL, SCOTLAND.

The Local Government (Arbroath Burgh Wards) Order (Scotland), 1931, dated 16th September 1931, made by the Secretary of State under the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929 (19 and 20 Geo. 5, c. 25), altering the boundaries of certain Wards of the Burgh of Arbroath.

Whereas by subsection (1) of Section 36 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, it is enacted that the provisions of the Town Councils (Scotland) Act, 1900, with regard to the alteration of the number of magistrates and councillors in burghs and to the number of councillors in each ward and to the division or re-division into wards shall cease to have effect as regards any large burgh within the meaning of the said Act of 1929, and that it shall be lawful for the Secretary of State on the representation of the Town Council of any large burgh by order, *inter alia*, to determine or alter the boundaries of the wards into which the burgh is divided:

And whereas it has been represented to the Secretary of State by the Town Council of the Burgh of Arbroath (hereinafter referred to as "the burgh"), which is a large burgh within the meaning of the said Act of 1929, that he should make an Order under the enactment above recited altering the boundaries of the

First (High Street and Millgate) and the Third (Abbey and Guthrie Port) Wards of the burgh:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the said representation:

Now therefore the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him as aforesaid hereby Orders as follows:

1. The boundaries of the First (High Street and Millgate) Ward, and the Third (Abbey and Guthrie Port) Ward of the burgh shall respectively be the boundaries as set forth in the Schedule to this Order.
2. This Order may be cited as the Local Government (Arbroath Burgh Wards) Order (Scotland), 1931.

BOUNDARIES OF FIRST (HIGH STREET AND MILLGATE) WARD.

From the Sea at East Links, thence along the line of the ancient Royalty, thence along the centre of the Main Road through Boulzie Hill, then along the centre of Hill Place to the Parish Church, thence from the Parish Church along the line of the ancient Royalty by the line of what was formerly School Wynd to the corner of Allan Street, thence along the centre of High Street to Townerook, thence Westward along the centre of James Street and Hume Street to the Bridge at Hume Street, thence from the centre of the Bridge at Hume Street along the centre of the Brothock to the Bridge at Panmure Street, thence along the line of the ancient Royalty to the wall of Dishland Hill, thence to the centre of Millgate Loan, thence along the Common Brae to the centre of the Railway Bridge at Alexandra Place, thence along the centre of the Dundee and Arbroath Railway to the existing Burgh Boundary, thence along the dyke on the south side of said Railway to the level Crossing at Elliot Junction, thence along the March of Panmure to the Sea, thence along the Sea in a north easterly direction to the point of commencement at East Links.

BOUNDARIES OF THIRD (ABBEY AND GUTHRIE PORT) WARD.

From the Sea Shore at East Links along the line of the ancient Royalty to the Boulzie Hill, thence along the centre of the Main Road through Boulzie Hill to Hill Place, thence along the centre of Hill Place to the Parish Church, thence along the line of the ancient Royalty by the line of what was formerly School Wynd to the corner of Allan Street, thence along the centre of High Street to Townerook, thence westward along the centre of James Street and Hume Street to the centre of the Bridge at Hume Street, thence along the centre of the Brothock to Stobcross Bridge, thence along the centre of the Road to the Railway Bridge and

along the centre of Cairnie Street and the Cairnie Branch of the Forfar Road to the Parliamentary Boundary near Herculesden Bridge, thence along the Parliamentary Boundary to the Montrose Road, thence along the Parliamentary Boundary to the foot bridge over Seaton Den, thence along the pathway on the north-east side of Victoria Park to the Whiting Ness, thence to the Sea, thence along the Sea in a south westerly direction to the point of commencement at East Links.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
