## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

THE DUMBARTON JOINT SANATORIUM BOARD (REVOCATION) ORDER, 1931, DATED 28TH SEPTEMBER 1931, MADE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR SCOTLAND.

Whereas by an Order, dated 4th October 1920, made by the Scottish Board of Health under Section 64 (3) of the National Insurance Act, 1911, the County Council of the County of Dunbarton, and the Town Councils of the Burghs of Dumbarton and Clydebank were combined for the purpose of providing, furnishing, managing and maintaining a sanatorium for the treatment of tuberculosis and making such other provision in connection therewith as might be deemed necessary:

1. This Order may be cited as the Dumbarton Joint Sanatorium Board (Revocation) Order, 1931.

2. The said Order, dated 4th October 1920, made by the Scottish Board of Health is hereby revoked as from the 15th day of May 1931, but without prejudice to the validity of anything duly done or suffered or to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder.
