(ARTHUR PURVIS.)

Whereas Arthur Purvis, L.M.S.S.A., formerly of The Hollies, Billingham-on-Tees, latterly at The City Sanatorium, Birmingham, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Arthur Purvis cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous

Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from today's date, from the said Arthur Purvis, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Arthur Purvis to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
