EDUCATIONAL ENDOWMENTS (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1928.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for situations in the General Post Office as Male Assistant Superintendent of Traffic (Class II.) in the London Telephone Service, and Male Assistant Traffic Superintendent in the Provinces will be held, commencing on the 28th April 1932, under the Regulations dated the 28th August 1928, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the first part of the Examination may be held:—Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Glasgow, Leeds, London and Manchester.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

Not fewer than 6 candidates will be appointed on the result of this Examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

No person will be admitted to examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received on or before the 3rd March 1932 an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
