ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Road Traffic Act, 1930, has made the Motor Vehicles (Authorisation of Special Types) Order (No. 5), 1932, to come into operation on the 1st day of November 1932.

HARBOURS, DOCKS AND PIERS (TEMPORARY INCREASE OF CHARGES) ACTS, 1920 TO 1922.
