# ELGIN AND LOSSIEMOUTH HARBOUR.

(ALTERATION OR INCREASE OF EXISTING RATES AND CHARGES; NEW RATES AND CHARGES; AMENDMENT OF ELGIN AND LOSSIEMOUTH HARBOUR ACTS AND ORDERS; AND OTHER PURPOSES.)

(c) The use or supply of sheds, cranes, weighing machines, warps, planks, ballast, water and any other works, conveniences, appliances, or commodities and services rendered by the Company;

and to authorise the Company to make, levy, demand and recover new or increased or additional rates, tolls, dues and charges in respect of all or any of the foregoing matters and things.

2. To extend, amend or repeal all or any of the provisions of the Elgin and Lossiemouth Harbour Acts and Orders, 1856 to 1901, relating to the rates, tolls, dues and charges which the Company are authorised to make, levy, demand and recover, and the lists or classes of rates and dues contained in the Schedule to the Elgin and Lossiemouth Harbour Order, 1901, and to reenact the same, with amendments, or substitute a new schedule or schedules therefor.

3. To make all such other provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving effect to any of the matters aforesaid or consequential thereon.

4. The Order will or may authorise compositions of or confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from rates, tolls, dues and charges, and may vary or extinguish all rights, powers and privileges which would interfere with or prevent the carrying into effect of the objects of the Order, and will or may confer other rights, powers and privileges.

And Notice is hereby further given that on or before the 30th day of November instant a copy of this Notice as published in the Edinburgh Gazette will be deposited for public inspection with the Sheriff Clerk of the County of Elgin, and at the Custom House, Pitgaveny Street, Lossiemouth, and a copy will also be deposited at the Office of the Minister of Transport, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.
