- 2. The thirty-first day of December nineteen hundred and thirty-three shall be the appointed day for the provisions of the Act specified in the first column of Part II. of the Schedule hereto for the purposes specified in the second column thereof.
- 3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 4. This Order may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (Date of Commencement) Order (No. 1), 1933.
