THE KING has been pleased by Royal Warrants, bearing date the 31st July 1933, to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Seal appointed to be kept and made use of in place of the Great Seal of Scotland, granting the rank and dignity of Counsel to His Majesty to Thomas Trotter, Esquire, Advocate, Thomas David King Murray, Esquire, Advocate, and William Donald Patrick, Esquire, Advocate, Members of the Scottish Bar.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 8th day of August 1933.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section 31 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (in this Order referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that the Act shall come into operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day shall be such day as His

Majesty may by Order in Council appoint, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The first day of October nineteen hundred and thirty-three shall be the appointed day for the provisions of the Act specified in the first column of Part I. of the Schedule hereto for the purposes specified in the second column thereof.

2. The thirty-first day of December nineteen hundred and thirty-three shall be the appointed day for the provisions of the Act specified in the first column of Part II. of the Schedule hereto for the purposes specified in the second column thereof.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (Date of Commencement) Order (No. 1), 1933.
