The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 E. 7. c. 29, 4-5 G. 5. c. 18, 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, 18-19 G. 5 c. 3, and 22-23 G. 5. c. 32), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft, and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft, and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November 1925 His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March 1883 for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December 1900 and at Washington on the 2nd June 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states: And whereas France has acceded to the said. Convention on behalf of the French Possessions Overseas:

And whereas by reason of the accession tothe said Convention of the said French Possessions Overseas the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft, and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said French l'ossessions Overseas or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in mannerhereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:--

1. The laws of the French Possessions Overseas confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft, and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said French Possessions Overseas or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to thosementioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents. and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall be applicable to the French Possessions Overseas.

3. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (French Possessions Overseas) Order, 1934.

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1929.

### MENTAL DEFECTIVES.

SCHEME made by the General Board of Control under Section 64 (b) of the Local Govern-ment (Scotland) Act, 1929, for the payment of contributions by the County Councils and by the Town Councils of large burghs to Voluntary Associations which undertake the duty of assisting or supervising defectives whilst not in institutions.

THE GENERAL BOARD OF CONTROL, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 64 (b) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, hereby make the following Scheme:-

1. Subject to the conditions prescribed in paragraph 2 of this Scheme, every Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council ") of the counties or of the large burghs named in column (1) of the Schedule to this Scheme

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shall, in each of the four financial years 1933-34, 1934-35, 1935-36, and 1936-37, pay by way of annual contribution to the Scottish Association for Mental Welfare the sums specified in columns (2) (a) and (2) (b) of the Schedule and placed opposite to the name of the Council.

2. It will be a condition of the payment of the contributions specified in the Schedule to this Scheme:—

(1) That the Board are satisfied as to the efficiency of the services provided by the Scottish Association for Mental Welfare in respect of which the contributions are payable;

(2) That no reduction of such services is made without the consent of the Board;

(3) That such services, and any premises in which those services are carried on, are open to inspection at all reasonable times by any person or persons appointed for that purpose by the Board; (4) That the said Association sends to the General Board of Control in each year a copy of the annual report of the Association on its work during the previous year, together with a statement of the accounts of the Association for that year relating to such work and a copy of the auditor's certificate and report (if any) thereon, and furnishes the Board from time to time with such other information relating to the services provided by the Association and the expenditure thereon as the Board may reasonably require.

3. Any dispute or difference between a Council and an Association in connection with any matter arising out of this Scheme shall be referred to the Board, whose decision shall be final and binding upon the Council and the Association.

4. This Scheme shall remain in force until 15th May 1937, subject to any alteration which may be made by the Board in accordance with the provisions of the Statute.
