ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931.

A draft Regulation made by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under Section 13 of the above-mentioned Act has been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and is published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulation is applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council on or before the 29th day of October 1934.

Addition to Regulation No. 26 passed by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom by Resolution at their meeting on 25th June 1934.
