WHEREAS the Department of Health for Scotland have, in pursuance of the powers competent to them under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that they have received a copy of an Interlocutor, dated 2nd October 1934, pronounced by the Sheriff-Substitute of Fife and Kinross, at Dunfermline, finding that the old Churchyard of Cairneyhill, situated in the village of Cairneyhill, Parish of Carnock, and County of Fife, is in a condition which is contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that Burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Churchyard, in terms of Section 5 of the aforesaid Act, except for the reservation of a right of burial in the said Churchyard in the cases of:—

- (1) Spouses of parties already interred in the said Churchyard;
- (2) Unmarried children of parties already interred therein;
- (3) Parents of children already interred therein;
- (4) George Duncan Fyfe, foreman railway surfaceman, and Mrs. Mary Young or Fyfe, his wife, both of Cairneyhill aforesaid.

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 21st day of February 1935 Notice of such
