(1) To consider a proposal to enlarge the boundaries of the existing Baillieston Special Lighting and Scavenging Districts to include the building development at Garrowhill Estate, Baillieston, the Church Army Housing Scheme at Barrachnie and the additional Housing Sites at Springhill and Muirside, Baillieston, within the Parish of Old Monkland;
