TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 27th December 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 30th December 1935 to Saturday the 4th January 1936 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or

Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock Saturday 12 o'clock on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 14 of the War Loan Act, 1919 Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Importation of Plants (Amendment) Order of 1935.

This Order prohibits the landing in England or Wales from any country other than Scotland, Northern Ireland, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands of any living plant of sugar beet or mangold (*Beta vulgaris* Linn.) except under licence from the Ministry, and requires the certificates prescribed in Article 4 of the Importation of Plants Order of 1933, except in the case of a consignment consisting wholly of potatoes, to include a statement that the consignment does not contain any plant of sugar beet or mangold.
