##### UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1935.

Notice of Proposal to make a Special Order varying and amending the Special Scheme of Unemployment Insurance for the Insurance Industry.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that he proposes by virtue of the powers conferred upon him by Section 73 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1935, and all powers in that behalf, to make a Special Order further varying and amending the Insurance Industry Special Scheme.

#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

##### PERAMBULATOR AND INVALID CARRIAGE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

##### PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April 1927, the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade Board (Great Britain) hereby give notice that they propose to vary general minimum time rates, piece work basis time rates and overtime rates for certain classes of male and female workers of 21 years of age or over.

Particulars of the proposed variations may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 29th May 1936. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade Board, Romney House, Marsham Street, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
