The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Department of Health for Scotland have, in pursuance of the powers competent to them under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that they have received a copy of an Interlocutor, dated 2nd June 1936, pronounced by the Sheriff of the County of Lanark, at Glasgow; finding that the Burial Ground known as Carmunnock Churchyard, in the Parish of Carmunnock and County of Lanark, is in a condition which is offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that Burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Churchyard, in terms of Section 5 of the aforesaid Act, except for the reservation of the right of burial in the said Churchyard of—

(1) Members of the family of William Crawford Stirling Stuart of Milton, Castle-milk and Torrance, in the vault situated against the south wall of the church in the said Churchyard, and in the vault lying to the north-west of lair No. 342 in the said Churchyard;

(2) spouses of persons who are already buried in the said Churchyard; and

(3) cremated human remains:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give Notice of such Representation

and to Order that the same be taken into consideration on the 30th day of January next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or Notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order or Notice thereof be fixed as required by the aforesaid Act on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish of Carmunnock one month before such Representation is considered.
