

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 25th June 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 28th June 1937 to Saturday the 3rd July 1937 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1932.

## WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

Whereas Robert Crawford, M.B., Ch.B. (Glasgow), of "Redthorpe," 125 Victoria Road, Kirkcaldy, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Robert Crawford cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the

Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Robert Crawford, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves, Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Robert Crawford to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.

## COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE SCOTTISH DISTRICT (COAL  
MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 25 of the Scottish District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, an amendment of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto has been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section I. of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendment and prescribe the 18th day of June 1937 as the date from which the said amendment shall come into force.

## SCHEDULE.

The Scottish District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended as follows:—

Clause 102 shall have effect as if the following sub-clause were added at the end thereof, that is to say:—

"(5) The operation of sub-clause (4) of this Clause shall be suspended during the prescribed periods ending between the 18th day of June 1937 and the 30th day of September 1937, inclusive."
