NOTICE is hereby given, in terms of Section 14 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1908, that a Special Meeting of the County Council of the County of Ayr will be held within the County Buildings, Ayr, on Tuesday, 27th July, at 10.30 o'clock a.m., to consider proposals—

(1) to alter and extend the area of Kilwinning Special Water Supply and Lighting Districts, in the Parish of Kilwinning, so as to include therein the County Council's Housing Scheme and contiguous areas.

(2) to alter and extend the area of Fairlie Special Water Supply, Drainage, and Lighting Districts, in the Parishes of Largs and West Kilbride, so as to include therein an area adjacent to the north boundary of the said Districts.

(3) to form the area at and about the Village of Dunure, in the Parish of Maybole, into Special Water Supply and Drainage Districts.

(4) to alter and extend the area of Loans Special Drainage and Scavenging Districts, in the Parish of Dundonald, so as to include therein the County Council's Housing Scheme and contiguous areas.
