WESTMINSTER, MARCH 28, 1808.

This day the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molineux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of his Majesty's Commission for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to his Majesty, until the end of the next session of Parliament, duties of customs on the goods, wares, and merchandize therein enumerated, in furtherance of the provisions of certain orders in Council.

An Act to continue, until the 25th day of March 1809, an Act of the 41st year of his present Majesty, for prohibiting the exportation from Ireland, and for permitting the importation into Ireland, duty free, of corn and other provisions.

An Act for amending and enlarging the powers of an Act of his present Majesty, for making and maintaining the Barnsley Canal navigation, and certain railways and other roads to communicate therewith; and for increasing the rates, tolls, and duties, thereby granted.

An Act to continue several Acts for granting a duty of two pennies Scots upon ale and beer brewed in the town of Aberbrothock, in the county of Forfar.

An Act for making and maintaining a road from Leeds to Roundhay, in the West Riding of the county of York.

And one private Act.
