PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April 1927, the Paper Bag Trade Board (Great Britain) hereby give notice that they propose to yary minimum rates of wages at present set out in their Notice P. (17), dated 28th February 1930, so as to provide for the current rates of

wages being paid for a week of 45 hours instead of 48 hours.

Particulars of the proposed variations may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

In accordance with section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the proposed variations which may be lodged with them within two months from 15th October 1937. Any such objection should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Paper Bag Trade Board, Metropole Buildings, Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C.2. It is desirable that objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
