TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. - 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1937.

The Department of Agriculture for Scotland hereby give notice that, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the abovementioned Act, they have made the following Regulations, in each case dated 15th December 1937:—

- 1. The Agricultural Wages Committees (Scotland) Regulations (No. 2), 1937 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1937, No. 1127/S.66, price 2d. net).
- 2. The Scottish Agricultural Wages Board Regulations (No. 2), 1937 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1937, No. 1126/S.65, price 1d. net).
- 3. The Agricultural Wages (Benefits or Advantages) (Scotland) Regulations, 1937 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1937, No. 1128/S.67, price 1d. net).

The first two sets of Regulations supersede Regulations made by the Department on the 11th October 1937 (Statutory Rules and Orders, Nos. 919/S.48 and 918/S.47). The revised Regulations include certain amendments undertaken on behalf of the Government in the course of proceedings in the House of Lords on 14th December 1937. The principal amendment is one authorising the Department to give representation on the agricultural wages committees or on the Scottish Agricultural Wages Board to any organisation, other than those specifically mentioned in Article 1 of the Regulations, which may prove to their satisfaction that it represents a substantial body of employers or workers as the case may be.

In the Agricultural Wages (Benefits or Advantages) (Scotland) Regulations, 1937, the Department lay down certain general principles to be observed by agricultural wages committees in their determination of the value at which benefits or advantages are to be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash.
