A PROCLAMATION

For appointing Tuesday, December 27, 1938, a Bank Holiday and a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland.

GEORGE, R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of the provisions of The Bank Holidays Act, 1871, and The Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, Do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this fourth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and in the Second year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS the Department of Health for Scotland have, in pursuance of the powers competent to them under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that they have received a copy of an Interlocutor dated 10th March 1938, pronounced by the Sheriff-Substitute of Perth and Angus, at Dundee, finding that the Burial Ground known as Old Mains Burial Ground in the Dundee Combination Parish and City and Royal Burgh of Dundee is in a condition which is offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Burial Ground in terms of Section 5 of the aforesaid Act except for the burial therein of cremated human remains:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration on the 16th day of December next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or Notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order, or Notice thereof, be fixed as required by the foresaid Act on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish affected one month before such Representation is considered.

ORDER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

WHEREAS the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the County of Aberdeen (in this Order called "the County"), the number of County Councillors for the County, and the number of Councillors to be elected by the Town Councils of the Burghs entitled to be represented on the County Council were determined by Orders dated the 21st October 1929 and the 5th November 1935 made by the Secretary of State under Section 8 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, and Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, respectively:

AND WHEREAS the County Council of the County have represented to me that it is desirable to alter the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of Newhills North (No. 42), Newhills South (No. 43), Cults (No. 45), and Drumoak and Peterculter (No. 46), and to increase the number of County Councillors for the County and the number of County Councillors to be elected for the landward area of the County and to alter the assignment of County Councillors to the burghs:

AND WHEREAS I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the representations of the County Council:

PRIVATE LEGISLATION PROCEDURE (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1936.

NOTICE is hereby given in terms of Section 1 (4) of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1936, that the Secretary of State, the Chairman of Committees of the House of Lords and the Chairman of Ways and Means in the House of Commons having considered a representation by the authorities of the Methodist Church that it is expedient that the undermentioned Parliamentary powers to be operative in Scotland and elsewhere which they desire to obtain should be conferred by one enactment have decided that the said powers would be more properly obtained by the promotion of a Private Bill than by the promotion of a Private Bill and of a Provisional Order under the said Act:—

- 1. To incorporate a Board to be called "The Trustees for Methodist Church Purposes"; to prescribe the constitution of the Board; to make provision for the first members and the appointment of new members; and to indemnify the Board and its members in connection with the exercise of their powers.
- 2. To dissolve the Trustees for Wesleyan Methodist Chapel Purposes (Registered) and the Trustees for United Methodist Church Purposes Registered and transfer to and vest in the new Board all the property rights and liabilities of the existing Trustees.
- 3. To empower the Board to receive and hold property upon trust connected with the Methodist Church.
- 4. To authorise the Annual Conference of the Methodist Church to adopt a Trust Deed declaring the trusts of the property transferred to or hereafter held by the Board and to make provision for altering such Trust Deed.
- 5. To transfer the orphanages of the Methodist Church situate at Alresford and Harrogate to the Trustees for the National Children's Home and Orphanage Registered to be held upon the same trusts as the property of such Trustees is held for the Methodist Church and to release and indemnify the existing trustees of the said orphanages.

- 6. To change the name of the Trustees for the Wesleyan Methodist Connexional Funds (Registered) to "The Trustees for the Methodist Connexional Funds (Registered)."
- 7. To empower the Annual Conference of the Methodist Church to remove trustees of any property held upon trusts for the use and benefit of the Methodist Church or any society institution or charity subsidiary or ancillary to the Methodist Church and to appoint new trustees in the place of trustees so removed.
