The Order of the Secretary of State dated the 25th October 1929 so far as relating to the electoral divisions of Renton East (No. 9), Garscadden (No. 25), and New Kilpatrick South (No. 26), the Order dated the 15th September 1932 so far as relating to the electoral division of Dunbarton (No. 19), and the Order dated the 4th November 1935 so far as relating to the electoral divisions of Millichen (No. 27) and Boclair (No. 27A) are hereby recalled, and from and after the date hereof the areas comprised in the said electoral divisions shall have the following descriptions and contents:—

No. of Division.	Name of Division.	Contents and Boundaries.
9	Renton East	The remainder of the parish of Cardross (exclusive of the portion included within the limits of the Burgh of Dumbarton; together with the portions of the parish of Dunbarton which lie to the west of the <i>medium filum</i> of the River Leven.
19	Dunbarton	The remainder of the parish of Dunbarton and that part of the parish of Old Kilpatrick which lies to the west of a line drawn in a generally northerly direction up the eastmost burn in enclosure No. 227A as delineated on Ordnance Survey Sheet NXXII. 8, Edition 1918, from the point at which it enters the River Clyde to the northern boundary of that enclosure, and thence due north to the parish boundary of the parish of Old Kil- patrick, exclusive of the portions of the parishes within the limits of the Burgh of Dumbarton.
25	Garscadden	That part of the parish of New Kilpatrick which is bounded on the north by the New Kilpatrick West division, and on the east by a line drawn from the junction of Thorn Road, Beursden, with the road leading from Stirling to Glasgow via Drymen in a southerly direction along the centre of the last-mentioned road to its junction with Drumchapel Road, and on the south by the centre line of Drumchapel Road to the boundary of the county.
26	New Kilpatrick South	That part of the parish of New Kilpatrick so far as situated within the County of Dunbarton which is bounded on the north by the Garscadden Division and on the north-east by a line drawn from the junction of Drum- chapel Road with the road from Stirling to Glasgow via Drymen in a southerly direction along the centre of the last-mentioned road to the boundary of the County.
27	Millichen,	That part of the parish of New Kilpatrick which lies to the east of the centre line of the road leading from Stirling to Glasgow and south of a line drawn along the Milngavie Road from its junction with the Stirling- Glasgow Road, generally in an easterly northerly and north-easterly direction along the centre of Kessington Road, Kessington Right-of-Way, and the centre of Boclair Road to the Eastern boundary of the County.
274	Boclair	That part of the parish of New Kilpatrick which lies to the east of the centre line of the road leading from Stirling to Glasgow via Drymen and to the south of a line drawn along the centre of Roman Road, Bearsden, to the north-western boundary of the London and North Eastern Bailway (Milngavie Branch) thence in a north- easterly direction along the said boundary to the point at which it meets the Craigdow Burn, thence in an easterly direction along the said burn to the boundary of the County along which it extends in a south-easterly and southerly direction to the point at which it meets the centre of Boclair Road, and on the south by the Millichen Division.
