FACTORIES ACT, 1937.

In pursuance of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this Notice, to make regulations under the Factories Act, 1937, entitled the Glass Bottles and Jars (Overtime) Regulations, 1938, modifying the provisions of Section 73 of the Act, as to overtime, to meet seasonal or other special pressure of work.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1936.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, the Minister of Health, and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the National Health Insurance Act, 1936, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, to make regulations to be entitled the National Health Insurance (Additional Benefits) Amendment Regulations, 1938.

And that, on account of urgency, the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, the Minister of Health, and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made regulations entitled the National Health Insurance (Additional Benefits) Amendment Regulations, 1938, to come into operation forthwith as provisional regulations, to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of that Act.
