TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 25th November 1938,

at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 28th November 1938 to Saturday the 3rd December 1938 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT ENGINEERS GRADE II. IN THE MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING DIVISION OF H.M. OFFICE OF WORKS.

N.B.—*Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but*

are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies. The regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 23 on a date to be fixed in respect of the Competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 30 years of age on that date.

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years during which they have so served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Candidates must have attained a satisfactory standard of general education, and must either

(a) be qualified for Associate Membership of the Institution of Civil Engineers or

(b) have passed examinations qualifying for a University degree in Engineering recognised by the above Institution as granting exemption from Sections A and B of the examination for Associate Membership of the above Institution or

(c) have been awarded a Whitworth Scholarship.

Candidates should have had at least six years' experience in electrical and mechanical engineering works of good standing, provided that whole-time study in a college or University at engineering subjects may be allowed to count

towards this period up to a maximum of three years.

5. H.M. Office of Works will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancies which they desire to fill, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Applications shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary, H.M. Office of Works, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from the Establishment Officer of that Department, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps of the value of ten shillings; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances.

Applications will be scrutinised by the Office of Works in association with the Civil Service Commissioners and the candidates who appear to be best qualified under the regulations will be summoned to appear before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, provided they find them qualified. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the Office of Works who will be represented thereon. The decision of the Selection Board will be final.

7. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health, and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of H.M. Works.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

8. A candidate selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid on application will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in industry or business, in the Forces, or otherwise.

HOLIDAYS WITH PAY ACT, 1938.

1. The Holidays with Pay (Agricultural Workers—Scotland) (Adaptation of Enactments) Regulations, 1938. (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1938, No. 1348/S.71, price 1d. net.)

These regulations adapt the provisions of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) (Scotland) Act, 1937, to enable the Agricultural Wages Committees, constituted in Scotland under that Act, to exercise the additional powers conferred upon them by the Holidays with Pay Act, 1938.

2. The Holidays with Pay (Agricultural Workers — Scotland) (Proceedings and Notices) Regulations, 1938. (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1938, No. 1349/S.72, price 1d. net.)

These regulations adapt the provisions governing the proceedings of the Scottish Agricultural Wages Board and the Agricultural Wages Committees in Scotland, and the provisions relating to Notices of proposals to make, fix, cancel, or vary rates of wages and procedure to be

observed in connection with the making of Orders, in order to enable such provisions to apply to the proceedings of the Board and Committees and to Notices of proposals and decisions in terms of the Holidays with Pay Act, 1938.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has received an application from the Joint Council for the Retail Distributive Trades Section of the Road Transport Industry, being an organisation representative of employers and workpeople in a section of the road transport industry concerned with the conveyance of goods which the Minister of Labour has certified to be a proper body in respect of the sections of the distributing trades which it represents, to make application for a variation of the periods of time laid down in Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended by Section 31 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, for the employment of drivers of road vehicles of certain types.

The variation applied for is to the effect that the period of 11 hours laid down in Section 19 (1) (ii.) of the Act of 1930 may be increased to 12 hours on not more than two days in each of the three weeks ending on the 17th, 24th, and 31st December 1938, the variation to apply only to those engaged in the delivery of goods from retail shops and/or stores to their customers.

As provided by the Act the Minister has referred the matter to the Industrial Court for advice. The Court has fixed Wednesday, 23rd

November, at 11 a.m., at 1 Abbey Garden, Great College Street, London, S.W.1, as the time and place for hearing parties to the application.

Copies of the proposals contained in the application for the variation of the periods of time laid down in Section 19 of the Act can be obtained from the Secretary of the Industrial Court at the address given above.

Persons representing organisations of employers or workpeople in the industry who may desire to make representations to the Court in the matter should either give notice beforehand to the Secretary of the Industrial Court that they desire to be heard or submit their representations in writing to the Secretary.

CORPORATION OF GLASGOW. ONE-WAY TRAFFIC IN STREETS.

CITY AND ROYAL BURGH OF GLASGOW. REGULATION AS TO ONE-WAY TRAFFIC IN STREETS.

The Corporation of the City of Glasgow, in virtue of the powers conferred on them by Section 38 of the Glasgow Corporation Order, 1929, under which they may from time to time make regulations prescribing the streets in which traffic by vehicles shall pass in one specified direction only, either generally or during specified hours, have resolved to make, and do hereby make, the following Regulation for the purpose aforesaid, viz. :—

No person shall at any time drive or cause to be driven any vehicle on the street specified in the First Column of the Schedule hereto, otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such street in the Second Column of the said Schedule.

PRIVATE LEGISLATION PROCEDURE
(SCOTLAND) ACT, 1936.

NOTICE is hereby given, in terms of Section 1 (4) of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1936, that the Secretary of State, the Chairman of Committees of the House of Lords and the Chairman of Ways and Means in the House of Commons, having considered a representation by the London and North Eastern Railway Company that it is expedient that the under-mentioned Parliamentary Powers to be operative in Scotland and elsewhere which they desire to obtain should be conferred by one enactment have decided that the said powers would be more properly obtained by the promotion of a Private Bill than by the promotion of a Private Bill and a Provisional Order under the said Act.

1. To authorise the establishment of a Superannuation Fund for certain employees of the London and North Eastern Railway Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company").

2. To prescribe the employees of the Company who shall become or shall be entitled or may be permitted to become Members of the Superannuation Fund and the contributions to be made by such employees and the Company and the other rules of the Superannuation Fund.

3. To transfer to the Superannuation Fund the members and moneys and assets of the North Eastern Railway Superannuation Fund, the Great Central Railway Pension Fund, the Great Eastern Railway New Superannuation Fund, the North British Railway Superannuation Fund, the Superannuation Fund established by Thompson McKay & Company Limited and the provisional superannuation fund established by the Company for persons entering their service since the 1st January 1923.

4. To transfer to the Superannuation Fund certain members and an equitable portion of the moneys and investments of the Railway Clearing System Superannuation Fund Cor-

poration, the Great Northern Railway Superannuation Fund, and the North Eastern Railway (Darlington Section) Superannuation Society.

5. To provide that the rules of the Superannuation Fund shall in relation to the employees transferred as aforesaid be in substitution for the rules and regulations of the funds referred to in paragraphs 3 and 4 hereof.

6. To provide for the payment out of the Superannuation Fund of certain allowances and payments which would have been payable out of the funds referred to in paragraphs 3 and 4 hereof.

7. To dissolve Thompson McKay & Company Limited and to provide for the distribution of the assets of the said Company.

8. To provide that no employee of the Company shall be entitled to claim or to be paid compensation for any pecuniary loss he may suffer by reason of the provisions of the intended Act and that all guarantees by the Company relating to the funds referred to in paragraphs 3 and 4 hereof and all obligations of the Company to pay allowances in respect of contributors to the said funds shall cease.

9. To repeal Section 50 of the London and North Eastern Railway Act, 1923.
