### MODIFICATION OF OPEN GENERAL EXPORT LICENCE No. G.L. 168.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of Condition (iii.) of the Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 168 (dated 14th July 1937), hereby order that that Licence is hereby suspended except in respect of:—

(i.) any aircraft registered outside the United Kingdom; or

(ii.) any aircraft clearing from Croydon, Heston or Southampton Water and engaged in the operation of a regular line or service of public air transport or in the performance

of a flight authorised by the local Air Ministry Control Officer.

### WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACTS, 1904 to 1926.

TO ALL HOLDERS OF LICENCES FOR EXPERIMENTAL WIRELESS TELEGRAPH TRANSMITTING STATIONS.

I, Major The Right Honourable George Clement Tryon, His Majesty's Postmaster-General, hereby give notice that, in pursuance of the provisions therein contained, all licences for the establishment of wireless telegraph sending and receiving stations for experimental purposes are hereby withdrawn.
