At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 19th day of December 1940.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of December 1940 (N.19376/1940), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas under the authority of Order in Council dated the 17th May 1920 extra duty pay for ratings in respect of General Work is authorised at the rate of 1s. per diem to Stokers, 2nd class (Continuous Service) and at the rate of 9d. per diem to Stokers, 2nd class (Non-continuous Service or Special Service):

“And whereas there is no longer any reason why extra pay should be paid to Stokers, 2nd

class, Non-continuous Service at lower rates than those received by Stokers, 2nd class, Continuous Service:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve payment of extra pay for General Work at the rate of 1s. a day to all Stokers, 2nd class.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
