

THE BURGH REGISTER OF SASINES  
(AR BROATH) DISCONTINUANCE  
ORDER, 1941, DATED 3RD JULY 1941, MADE  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE  
BURGH REGISTERS (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1926  
(16 AND 17 GEO. V. C. 50).

Whereas the Town Council of the Burgh of Arbroath have intimated under subsection (1) of section one of the Burgh Registers (Scotland) Act, 1926, that the office of the Keeper of the Burgh Register of Sasines for the said Burgh has become vacant:

Now therefore I, The Right Honourable Thomas Johnston, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said subsection do hereby order as follows:—

1. The Burgh Register of Sasines for the Burgh of Aberbrothock or Arbroath shall be discontinued from and after the 31st day of August 1941.
2. This Order shall be recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Forfar.
3. This Order may be cited as the Burgh Register of Sasines (Arbroath) Discontinuance Order, 1941.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 11th July 1941, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1941, to the amount of £75,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 14th July 1941 to Saturday the 19th July 1941 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
