This day the Royal Assent was given by Commission to the following Acts:—

- Appropriation Act, 1941.
- National Health Insurance, Contributory Pensions and Workmen's Compensation Act, 1941.
- War Damage to Land (Scotland) Act, 1941.
- Landlord and Tenant (War Damage) (Amendment) Act, 1941.
- Pharmacy and Medicines Act, 1941.
- Provisional Orders (Marriages) Confirmation Act, 1941.

Under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940, the Secretary of State has made an Order extending by three years from Whitsunday 1941 the time limited by the Fourth Article of the agreement set forth in the First Schedule to the Glasgow Corporation Order, 1936, during which the Glasgow Corporation is bound to give actual possession to Messrs. James Templeton & Co. of the area of ground containing 1580 square yards referred to in the agreement.
