The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 2nd instant, to appoint Arthur Holmes, Esq., D.Sc., A.R.C.Sc., F.R.S., M.R.I.A., M.I.Min.E., F.G.S., Professor of Geology in the University of Durham, to be Regius Professor of Geology in the University of Edinburgh.

The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 30th ultimo, to direct a Commission to be passed under the Seal appointed to be kept and made use of in place of the Great Seal of Scotland, nominating and appointing Alexander Archibald Hagart Spiers to be His Majesty's Lieutenant of the County of Renfrew, in the room of Sir Hugh Shaw-Stewart, Bt., K.C.B., deceased.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 9th April 1943, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1942, to the amount of £80,000,000.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 12th April 1943 to Saturday the 17th April 1943 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.
6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## Office of the High Commissioner for India.

The Secretary of State for India has appointed Mr. Frank Edward Nelson Anning, Deputy Superintendent, Mercantile Marine Office, Glasgow, and Mr. George Robertson Burnett, Deputy Superintendent, Mercantile Marine Office, Lyness, to superintend the transfer of Lascars or other persons and to grant the Certificate required under Section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vic., Cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every Lascar or other person in respect of whom such Certificate is applied for is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.
