MERCHANT SHIPPING ACTS, 1894 to 1906.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the draft of an Order in Council under section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, to provide that certain ships which were foreign ships immediately before they become Government ships should not be prohibited from flying their national colours.

Order, 1935, (Extension of Time) Order, 1940, for the completion of the said dam.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that he proposes to make an Order amending (i.) the proviso to byelaw 2 in the Order of the Secretary of State (No. 11) (S.R. & O., 1924, No. 1129) as amended by the Order of the Secretary of State (No. 11A) (S.R. & O., 1939, No. 1787) so as to increase, subject to certain conditions, the number of detonators and electric detonators which may be conveyed in the same carriage or boat with explosive of another Class or Division from 6000 to 10,000, and (ii.) regulation (p) contained in byelaw 4 in the said Order of the Secretary of State (No. 11) so as to increase the quantity of explosive which may be conveyed in any one carriage

enclosed on all sides with wood or metal from 4000 lb. to 6000 lb.

Copies of the draft Order amending the byelaws may be obtained from the Under Secretary of State, Room 116, Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, and any objection or suggestion relating to the proposed Order should be received within two weeks from the date hereof.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department also proposes to approve an amendment to the Conditions under which the employment of petrol-driven and oil-driven vehicles for the conveyance of explosives on roads was approved on the 11th July 1933.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated :—Cattle plague, or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*) 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*) 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*) 1850; rabies 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*) 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*) 1928. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.

No case of Fowl Pest (*pestis avium*) has been confirmed in Great Britain since the 11th January 1937, the date as from which the disease was first notifiable. So far as is known, however, Fowl Pest has not existed in Great Britain since 1933.
