The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This day the Royal Assent was given by Commission to the following Acts:—

- Expiring Laws Continuance Act, 1943.
- Local Elections and Register of Electors (Temporary Provisions) Act, 1943.
- Mining Industry (Welfare Fund), Act, 1943.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of November 1943 (N.28535 43), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 5th July 1929 provision is made for payment of allowances to the Senior Cook or Cook (S) rating employed under the General Mess system in ships and establishments, other than R.N. Barracks, with 250 or more in the General Mess :

“And whereas there are a number of establishments having messes where the victualling allowance is pooled, and the food is obtained, prepared in the raw state and cooked in bulk :

“And whereas we consider that in such messes precisely the same work is required of the Senior Cook rating as would be required in a General Mess correctly so described :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment to the Senior Cook rating employed in a ship or establishment victualling 250 or more where, although the Ship's Company is messed on the victualling allowance system, the victualling allowance is pooled and the responsibilities of the Senior Cook rating are similar to those in a General Mess, as follows :—

“Note.—In Establishments where the Mess is divided into Blocks with separate galleys, the allowances may be paid in respect of each block providing for 250 or more ratings.	

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 24th December 1943, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1943, to the amount of £90,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday the 28th December 1943 to Friday the 31st December 1943 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
