THE SEEDS (SCOTLAND) (AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1944.

The Secretary of State for Scotland has made the Seeds (Scotland) (Amendment) Regulations, 1944.

The Regulations, which come into force on 15th July 1944, apply to seed potatoes obtained from the 1944 crop and provide that in the case of a sale or exposure for sale of Scottish-grown seed potatoes the following particulars should be stated :—

- (a) The name and address of the seller.
- (b) A statement as to the class of the seed potatoes, that is, whether they are :—

Certified (Scotch) and the reference letters and number of the relative certificate issued under the scheme for the inspection of growing crops of potatoes authorised by the Secretary of State for Scotland, or
Uncertified (Scotch).

- (c) A statement of the variety, size and dressing.
