The KING has been pleased to direct the issue of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm to the following effect:—

GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God of Great Britain Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas KING Defender of the Faith Emperor of India. To all Archbishops Dukes Marquesses Earls Viscounts Bishops Barons Baronets Knights Citizens and Burgesses and all other Our faithful Subjects whatsoever to whom these Presents shall come Greeting WHEREAS by section six of an Act passed in the first year of Our Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1937" it is amongst other things enacted that in the event of Our absence or intended absence from Our United Kingdom We may in order to prevent delay or difficulty in the despatch of public business by Letters Patent under the Great Seal delegate for the period of that absence to Counsellors of State such of the Royal functions as may subject to the exceptions provided in the said Act be specified in the Letters Patent AND WHEREAS it is Our intention to be absent from Our United Kingdom for the purpose of visiting Our Forces beyond the Seas AND WHEREAS the Counsellors of State to whom Royal functions may by virtue of the said section as amended by an Act passed in the seventh year of Our Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1943" now be delegated by Us as aforesaid are Our Most dearly beloved Consort The Queen Our Most dearly beloved Daughter Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Our Most dear and entirely beloved Brother and Most faithful Counsellor His Royal Highness Prince Henry William Frederick Albert Duke of Gloucester Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order Our Most dear and entirely beloved Sister Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal Victoria Alexandra Alice Mary Lady of the Imperial Order of the Crown of India Dame Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order Dame Grand Cross of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire and Our Most dear and entirely beloved Cousin Her Royal Highness Princess Alexandra Victoria Alberta Edwina Louise Duchess of Fife (Princess Arthur of Connaught) KNOW YE that We do hereby by virtue of the provisions of the said Act delegate for the period of Our said absence to the said Counsellors of State that is to say to Our Consort The Queen The Princess Elizabeth The Duke of Gloucester The Princess Royal and Princess Arthur of Connaught the Royal functions hereinafter specified to be exercised jointly by not less than two of their number subject to the condition that they shall not

act in any matter or thing on which it is signified by Us or appears to them that Our special approval should previously be obtained and accordingly We do by these Presents delegate and grant unto the said Counsellors of State or any two of them full power and authority during the period of Our said absence to summon and hold on Our behalf Our Privy Council and to signify thereat Our approval of any matter or thing to which Our approval in Council is required and further to approve and sign on Our behalf commissions for signifying the Royal Assent to Acts of Parliament except an Act touching any of the matters for which provision is made in the Act of Settlement or touching Our Royal Style and Titles and to approve and sign on Our behalf any proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document requiring Our Signature which relates to the affairs of Our United Kingdom India Burma and Our Colonies and Protectorates or Territories administered under Mandate by Our Government in the United Kingdom and to do on Our behalf any matter or thing required to be done in relation to any such proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document and further to do on Our behalf any matter or thing which by virtue of Our Royal Prerogative or of any statutory or other power We are authorised to do for the safety and good government of Our United Kingdom India Burma Our Colonies and Protectorates and the said Territories save only that as provided in the said Act they the said Counsellors of State shall not have power to dissolve Parliament otherwise than on Our express instructions transmitted by Us and shall not grant any rank title or dignity of the peerage and further that they shall not receive any homage required to be done to Ourselves and shall not approve and sign any warrant submission or other document set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed Commanding all and singular Archbishops Dukes Marquesses Earls Viscounts Bishops Barons Baronets Knights Citizens and Burgesses and all other Our Officers Ministers and Subjects that in everything appertaining to the matters aforesaid they be attendant counselling and helping the said Counsellors of State as it behoves them.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague, or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*) 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*) 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*) 1850; rabies 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*) 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*) 1928. Dourine (*exanthema costale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.

No case of Fowl Pest (*pestis aviium*) has been confirmed in Great Britain since the 11th January 1937, the date as from which the disease was first notifiable. So far as is known, however, Fowl Pest has not existed in Great Britain since 1933.

TUBERCULOSIS ORDER OF 1938.

The number of bovine animals slaughtered under the Tuberculosis Order of 1938 during the period 1st April to 30th June 1944 was 3,484.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 4th August 1944, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1944, to the amount of £110,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday the 8th August 1944 to Saturday the 12th August 1944 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PURCHASE TAX.

The Treasury hereby give notice, pursuant to the powers of Section 20 of the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1940, that they propose to make an Order directing that purchase tax on articles being or comprising buttons made wholly of mother of pearl shall be reduced from 100 per cent. to the basic rate of 33½ per cent.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE, CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS, AND WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1941.
