Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act. 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Order :-

Order No. 6387. (Dated 14th August 1944.)

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 39 of 1944.

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles to the North and East and 30 miles to the West of Pitlochry, Perthshire, and within approximately 15 miles of the City of Perth to be an infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-andmouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restricti ns) Order of 1938 are applied. The Area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Angus, Fife, and Perth and Kinross.
