At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 22nd day of February 1945.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Mamorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of February 1945 (N 50050/44) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

Council:

"And whereas Orders in Council dated 19th December 1923, 17th December 1924, 14th December 1926, 8th August 1933, 28th May 1936, 24th October 1940, and 23rd February 1942 sanction the payment of extra duty pay to noncommissioned officers and men, in appointments specified, at the several Royal Marine Divisions and the Royal Marine Depot, Deal, and at rifle ranges abroad; also for casual services, as prescribed for Seamen and Royal Marines afloat, when Royal Marines are on shore strength:

"And whereas Order in Council dated 29th June 1934

"And whereas Order in Council dated 29th June 1934 sanctions the payment of extra duty pay of 1s. a day to Corporal, Royal Marines, employed on Police and clerical duties at the Naval Picket House, Valetta, Malta:

"And whereas Orders in Council dated 29th January 1929, 1st October 1932, 27th October 1936, 1st July 1937, 24th February 1938, 5th September 1939, 17th November 1939, 30th May 1941, 10th October 1941, 10th February 1943, 22nd March 1943, and 20th April 1943 sanction the payment of extra duty pay for specific appointments when Royal Marine ranks are organised in service units:

"And whereas certain non-commissioned officers and ranks of the Royal Marines have been trained in coding duties up to a standard equal to that obtaining in the Coder Branch of the Royal Navy and we consider that such non-commissioned officers and ranks are deserving of additional remuneration at the rate of 3d. a day when employed on coding duties equivalent to those required from Royal Naval Coders.

"And whereas the appointments and rates of extra duty pay sanctioned by the aforesaid Orders in Council with the addition of extra duty pay for coding duties are set out in the annexed schedules:

"And whereas, owing to the expansion and reorganisation of the Corps of Royal Marines to meet the changing needs of the present time, non-commissioned officers and ranks are now employed in units and explishments which do not come within the scope of the existing Orders in Council, but in which appointments of the same nature are equally necessary for the administration and performance of the functions of the formations:

"And whereas we consider that non-commissioned officers and ranks performing the duties in all such appointments are equally deserving of similar extra remuneration:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may

be graciously pleased by your Order in Council to sanction the payment of extra duty pay, at our discretion, to noncommissioned officers and ranks of the Royal Marines for the appointments and duties set out in the annexed schedules, at the rates and subject to such restrictions and conditions as are therein defined, in such units and establishments as we may from time to time deem appropriate.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.
