CONSTRUCTIONAL SCHEME No. 3.  
FANNICH PROJECT.

THE Electricity Commissioners have approved a Constructional Scheme prepared by the North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board in accordance with Section 5 of the

Hydro-Electric Development (Scotland) Act, 1943, providing for the construction of Works of which the situation is shown in Part I. of the Schedule hereto; and for the acquisition of the Land specified in Part II. of the said Schedule; and the Scheme has been submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation.
