GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God of Great Britain Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India:

To all whom these Presents may come:

GREETING!

Whereas We did by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual dated the Tenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and forty institute the Order of Burma as a means of rewarding the long, faithful and honourable service of members of certain of Our Armed Forces in Burma:

And whereas it is Our Will and Pleasure to extend the operation of the conditions of appointment to permit of awards of the Order for gallantry in certain cases:

Now Know Ye that We do by these Presents for Us Our Heirs and Successors make certain amendments for the governance of the Order:

That is to say:

For the existing Second Ordinance the following shall be substituted:

"*Secondly:* It is ordained that appointment to the Order may be made by Our Governor of Burma from among Governor's Commissioned Officers of the Burma Army, Warrant Officers of the Burma Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and of the Burma Volunteer Air Force for acts of conspicuous gallantry and to Governor's Commissioned Officers of the Burma Army, the Burma Frontier Force or the Burma Military Police for long, faithful and honourable service."

The amendment will have effect from the sixteenth day of March One thousand nine hundred and forty five.

ROYAL WARRANT.

GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God of Great Britain Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India:

To all whom these Presents may come:

GREETING!

Whereas We did by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual dated the Tenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and forty institute the Burma Gallantry Medal as a means of adequately rewarding acts of gallantry by members of certain of Our Armed Forces in Burma:

And whereas We desire to amend the list of those eligible to earn the reward:

Now Know Ye that We do by these Presents for Us Our Heirs and Successors make the following amendments for its governance:

That is to say:

For the existing Second Ordinance the following shall be substituted:

"*Secondly:* It is ordained that the Medal may be conferred by Our Governor of Burma upon Non-Commissioned



Officers and other ranks of the Burma Army, the Burma Frontier Force, the Burma Military Police, Petty Officers and ratings of the Burma Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and Non-Commissioned Officers and other ranks of the Burma Volunteer Air Force, for any act of conspicuous gallantry performed in connection with their duties."

The amendment will have effect from the sixteenth day of March One thousand nine hundred and forty-five.
