LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACTS.

CONSTITUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF STIRLING.

ORDER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

WHEREAS the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the County of Stirling (hereinafter referred to as "the County"), the number of County Councillors for the County and the apportionment of these County Councillors between the landward area and the burghs entitled to be represented on the County Council of the County (hereinafter referred to as "the County Council") were determined by Orders dated the 16th October 1929 and the 7th November 1935, made by the Secretary of State under Section 8 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, and Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, respectively;

AND WHEREAS the boundaries of the burgh of Stirling have been extended, and it has been represented to the Secretary of State by the County Council that it is desirable in consequence to combine the electoral divisions of Logie (No. 12) and Cambusbarron (No. 14) accordingly;

AND WHEREAS it has been further represented to the Secretary of State by the County Council that it is desirable to alter the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of Bannockburn (No. 13): Sauchie (No. 15): Polmaise (No. 16): Cowie (No. 18): Larbert (No. 25): Stenhousemuir North (No. 26): Stenhousemuir South (No. 27): Carron (No. 28): Falkirk Central (No. 29): Bonnybridge East (No. 30): Falkirk West (No. 31): Falkirk East (No. 32): Bothkennar (No. 33): Shieldhill (No. 34): Redding (No. 35): Polmont (No. 36) and Muiravonside West (No. 38) and to increase the number of County Councillors for the County and the number of County Councillors to be elected for the landward area of the County;

AND WHEREAS it has been represented to the Secretary of State by the Town Councils of Falkirk and Stirling that it is desirable to increase the number of County Councillors assigned to these Burghs;

AND WHEREAS the Secretary of State is of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representations to the extent and in the manner hereinafter provided;

NOW THEREFORE the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, as read with the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The number of County Councillors for the County shall be increased from 72 to 76.

2. The number of County Councillors to be elected for the landward area of the County shall be increased from 40 to 42.

3. The Order of the Secretary of State dated 16th October 1929, so far as relating to the electoral divisions of Logie (No. 12): Bannockburn (No. 13): Cambusbarron (No. 14): Sauchie (No. 15): Polmaise (No. 16): Cowie (No. 18): Larbert (No. 25): Stenhousemuir North (No. 26): Stenhousemuir South (No. 27): Carron (No. 28): Falkirk Central (No. 29): Bonnybridge East (No. 30): Falkirk West (No. 31): Falkirk East (No. 32): Bothkennar (No. 33): Shieldhill (No. 34): Redding (No. 35): Polmont (No. 36) and Muiravonside West (No. 38) is hereby recalled, and from and after the date hereof the Area comprised in the said electoral divisions so far as it forms part of the landward area of the County shall be divided into electoral divisions having the following descriptions and contents, viz.:—

12	Bannockburn North	That part of the Parish of St. Ninians contained within the following boundary:— Commencing at the main Stirling to Edinburgh Road at the boundary of the Burgh of Stirling and following the said Burgh boundary northwards to the L.M.S. Railway; thence following the centre of the said Railway in a south-easterly direction to Greenyards Farm; then in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the Road from Cowie to Bannockburn until it meets the main Stirling to Edinburgh Road at Stein's Square and continuing thereafter along the centre of the said Main Road through Bannockburn to the Stirling Burgh Boundary.
13	Bannockburn South	That part of the Parish of St. Ninians contained within the following boundaries:— Commencing at the main Stirling to Edinburgh Road at the boundary of the Burgh of Stirling and following the centre line of said main Road in a south-easterly direction through Bannockburn to Stein's Square, and thereafter, following the Cowie Road to Greenyards Farm; thence in a southerly direction following the right-of-way to the Sink Road and then continuing along the centre line of the Sink Road to the main Stirling to Edinburgh Road; thereafter crossing the said Main Road and continuing along the centre line of the Road leading by Craigbeg Quarry to the crossroads at Craigbeg Cottage; then in a northerly direction along the centre line of the Road leading to Park Cottage; thereafter from Park Cottage in a north-westerly direction following the right-of-way to its junction with the Muir Road at Back o' Muir Farm; and continuing along the centre line of the said Muir Road to Muirside and thereafter following the right-of-way to Cat Craig Quarry and northwards to the Road leading from Newlands to the Bannock Burn; thence following along the centre line of the said Road to a point opposite the Sawmill on the said Bannock Burn; thereafter following the <i>medium filum</i> of the said Burn northwards to the boundary of the Lands of Hillpark and thereafter along the westmost boundary of the said Lands of Hillpark and continuing northwards along the line of a Burn to the Stirling Burgh boundary and thence following the said Burgh boundary to the main Stirling to Edinburgh Road.

14	Cambusbarron and Logie.	(1) That part of the Parish of St. Ninians which lies to the west of the Burgh of Stirling and to the west and north of a line drawn in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the Road leading from Stirling to Fintry by Coxithill, Murrayshall, Berryhill and Easter Cringate, from the point at which the said Road crosses the boundary of the Burgh of Stirling to the point at which it enters the Parish of Fintry; (2) the Parish of Stirling exclusive of the portion included within the limits of the Burgh of Stirling; and (3) the Parish of Logie exclusive of the portion included within the limits of the Burghs of Bridge of Allan and Stirling.
15	Sauchie ... ..	That part of the Parish of St. Ninians which lies to the south of the Cambusbarron Division and of the Burgh of Stirling, and to the west of the Bannockburn South Division following the boundary of said Division southwards to the Cross Roads at Craigbeg Cottage; thence along the centre of the Road past Roadhead Farm till it meets the Roman Road near West Plean; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the last mentioned Road to the point at which the Woodcockfauld Road joins it, and thence along the said Woodcockfauld Road to the boundary of the Parish.
16	Polmaise ... ..	That part of the Parish of St. Ninians which lies to the north-east of the Bannockburn North Division and to the east of the Burgh of Stirling and to the north of the middle line of the Cowie Road in the said Parish from a point immediately to the East of Greenyards Farm to a point near Burnhead Steading, and of a line drawn thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundary to the Lands of Throsk to the Parish boundary.
18	Cowie ... ..	The remainder of the Parish of St. Ninians exclusive of the portion included within the limits of the Burgh of Stirling.
25	Larbert ... ..	That part of the Parish of Larbert which is included within the following boundary, viz.: a line commencing at the point where the London, Midland and Scottish Railway line intersects the boundary between the Parishes of Larbert and Dunipace; thence following the centre of the said Railway line in a southerly direction until it reaches the boundary of the Burgh of Falkirk on the Parish boundary; thence following the boundary between the Parishes of Larbert and Falkirk westwards until the said boundary meets the boundary between the Parishes of Larbert and Dunipace, and thence following the last mentioned boundary northwards to the point of commencement.
26	South Broomage and Muirhall.	That part of the Parish of Larbert which is bounded on the north and north-west by the Plean and Dunipace and Denny North Divisions and on the west by the Larbert Division and elsewhere by a line taken along the centre of the River Carron from the boundary of the Larbert Electoral Division to the centre of the Road leading to Dorrator Steps; thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said Road to Carron Company's lade; thence in a north-easterly direction along the said lade to the point where the How Burn joins the lade; thence in a north-westerly direction along the course of the said How Burn until it reaches the centre of the Main Street; thence in a north-easterly direction to the junction of the said Main Street with Burnhead Road; thereafter in a northerly direction along the centre of Burnhead Road to the Tryst Golf Course and thereafter continuing in a northerly direction along the west boundary of the Tryst Golf Course to the centre of Bellsdyke Road; thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Bellsdyke Road to Crossmuirhead at the junction with the Road leading from Drum to Carron and thereafter along the centre of said Road in a north-easterly direction to its junction with the Parish boundary.
27	Stenhousemuir North	That part of the Parish of Larbert which is bounded on the south by the River Carron, on the west by the eastmost boundary of the South Broomage and Muirhall Electoral Division from its junction with the River Carron to the Bellsdyke Road; thence eastwards along the centre of the Bellsdyke Road to Tryst Road; thereafter southwards along the centre of the Tryst Road to the centre of the Larbert/Carron Road; thereafter in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the said Larbert/Carron Road, the centre of the Road leading by Carron Park to Mount Carron to its southmost point; thence due south to the boundary of the Parish at the River Carron.
28	Stenhousemuir South	That part of the Parish of Larbert which is bounded on the North by the centre of the Bellsdyke Road from Tryst Road to Crossmuirhead; thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the Road leading past Anton's Hill and Mount Gerald and thereafter along the centre of the Alloa Road to its junction with the Mineral Railway leading from Carron Works to Carronhall Colliery; thence along the centre of the Mineral Railway in a south-westerly direction to the Larbert/Carron Road and thereafter in a westerly direction along the centre of the said Larbert/Carron Road to the boundary of the Stenhousemuir North Electoral Division, and thereafter in a northerly direction following the boundary of the Stenhousemuir North Division via Tryst Road to the Bellsdyke Road.
29	Carron ... ..	That part of the Parish of Larbert bounded on the west by the Stenhousemuir North Division from its junction with the River Carron northwards to the Larbert/Carron Road via the Road leading by Carron Park to Mount Carron; thereafter by the Stenhousemuir South Division following its boundary first in an easterly direction by the centre of the Larbert/Carron Road; thence north-easterly along the centre of the Mineral Railway leading from Carron Works to Carronhall Colliery and thereafter by the centre of the Alloa Road and Mount Gerald to Crossmuirhead; thereafter by the eastmost boundary of the South Broomage and Muirhall Electoral Division along the centre of the Road leading from Drum to Carron to its junction with the Parish boundary; thence in a south-easterly direction along the boundary of Airth Parish to its junction with the Bothkennar Division in Grangemouth Parish; thereafter in a southerly direction along the centre of the Carronshore Road to its junction with Waterslap Road; thereafter along the centre of the Waterslap Road to Lady's Gate in a south-westerly direction and continuing along the centre of the Carronshore Road to the Chapel Burn; thence in an easterly direction by the Chapel Burn to the River Carron and thereafter along the boundary of Falkirk Parish by the Centre of the River Carron to the boundary of Stenhousemuir North Electoral Division.
30	Bonnybridge East...	That part of the Parish of Falkirk which is included within the following boundary, viz.: a line drawn along the Bonny Water, the Rowantree Burn, the southern fence of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway line and the centre of the Greenhill Road to the Union Canal and on a continuation thereof northwards to the Bonny Water.
31	Falkirk West ... ..	That part of the Parish of Falkirk which lies to the west of the Shieldhill and Bonnybridge Divisions.
32	Laurieston North ...	That part of the Parish of Falkirk bounded on the south by the centre of Mary Street, Laurieston, and thereafter eastwards by the centre of the Polmont Road; on the west by the Burgh of Falkirk; on the north by the Burgh of Grangemouth; and on the east by the Grange Burn and thereafter by the Westquarter Burn.
33	Laurieston South ...	That part of the Parish of Falkirk bounded on the north by the centre of Mary Street, Laurieston, and thereafter by the centre of Polmont Road; on the east by the Westquarter Burn; on the south by the centre of the London and North Eastern Railway line and tunnel to the boundary of the Burgh of Falkirk; and on the west by said boundary of the Burgh of Falkirk.
34	Bothkennar and Carronshore.	The remainder of the Parish of Larbert and that part of the Parish of Grangemouth lying to the north of the River Carron bounded on the north by the Parish of Airth; and on the west by the Carron Electoral Division

35	Shieldhill ... ..	(1) That part of the Parish of Falkirk which is bounded on the north, east and south by the Burgh of Falkirk, the centre of the London and North Eastern Railway line and tunnel, and the Parish of Grangemouth; and on the west by a line drawn along the centre of the Road leading northwards past Beam Farm from Garbethill to Bonnybridge to the point at which the Rowantree Burn touches the said Road and thereafter along the said Burn in a northerly direction to the Parish boundary. (2) That part of the Parish of Grangemouth which lies to the south of the Union Canal from its junction with the Westquarter Burn to the boundary of the Brightons Electoral Division; thence following the boundary of said Division to its junction with Sunnyside Road; thereafter following the centre of said Road westwards to its junction with the Parish boundary at California and thereafter following the Parish boundary in a westerly, northerly and easterly direction to the point of commencement at the Westquarter Burn.
36	Redding and West-quarter.	That part of the Parish of Grangemouth which is bounded on the south by a line taken along the centre of the Union Canal from the Westquarter Burn eastwards to Meadowbank, at the point where the Road Bridge crosses the London and North Eastern Railway, and thereafter eastwards along the centre of the London and North Eastern Railway line to Polmont Junction Station; on the north-east by the centre of the road leading from Polmont Station northwards via Parkhill to the Salmon Inn Brae at its junction with the Falkirk to Edinburgh Road and continuing westwards along the centre of said Road to the Westquarter Burn; and on the north-west by the centre of said Westquarter Burn.
37	Brightons ... ..	That part of the Parish of Grangemouth contained within the following boundaries, viz.: Commencing on the Union Canal at the point where the Road leading from Rumford by Parkhead and Brightons to Blair's Bridge crosses the Union Canal westwards following the boundary of the Redding and Westquarter Electoral Division in an eastern direction to Polmont Junction Station; then in a southerly direction following the centre of the Road leading from Polmont Station to Brightons and the centre of the Quarry Brae to the centre of the main Road running from Redding via Rumford to Maddiston; then continuing along the centre of said main Road in a north-westerly direction to the junction of Sunnyside Road; thereafter continuing in a westerly direction along the centre of the Sunnyside Road through Wallacetone to the boundary of the Shieldhill Electoral Division at the south-east corner of enclosure No. 1293; thence in a north-westerly direction in a straight line through enclosure No. 1293 to the north-west corner of the said enclosure No. 1293; thence in a straight line in a northerly direction to the south-east corner of enclosure No. 1301; thence continuing in a northerly direction along the east boundary of said enclosure No. 1301 to a point on the Mineral Railway opposite the north-east corner of said enclosure No. 1301 and forty feet therefrom; thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said Mineral Railway to the Polmont Burn; thence eastwards by the said Burn to the Road leading from Rumford by Parkhead and Brightons to Blair's Bridge and thence in a north-westerly direction to the Union Canal.
38	Polmont ... ..	The remainder of the Parish of Grangemouth exclusive of the portion included within the limits of the Burgh of Grangemouth.
40	Muiravonside West	The remainder of the Parish of Muiravonside together with that portion of the Parish of Grangemouth lying between the Parish boundary at the Gardrum Burn and the Shieldhill and Brightons Electoral Divisions taken along the Sunnyside Road leading from California to Rumford and thereafter by the Main Road leading southwards to the said Gardrum Burn.

4. The Electoral Divisions of Muiravonside East (No. 37), Slamannan East (No. 39) and Slamannan West (No. 40) shall be re-numbered 39, 41 and 42 respectively.

**TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.**

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 5th October 1945, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1945, to the amount of £130,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 8th October 1945 to Saturday the 13th October 1945 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

REGULATIONS DATED THE 27TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1945 MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER ARTICLE 6 OF THE ORDER IN COUNCIL DATED THE 22ND DAY OF JULY 1920 WITH RESPECT TO THE PERIOD OF PROBATION TO BE SERVED BY THE CLASSES OF CIVIL SERVANTS TO WHOM THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 6 OF THE ORDER IN COUNCIL DATED THE 10TH DAY OF JANUARY 1910 APPLIED.

In pursuance of Article 6 of the said Order of the 22nd day of July 1920 the Treasury hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. After a certificate of qualification has been issued by His Majesty's Civil Service Commissioners in favour of a candidate, he shall enter on a period of probation of one year or such extended period not exceeding two years as may be

prescribed by the Head of his Department. During this time his conduct and capacity shall be subjected to such tests as may be determined by the Head of his Department and he shall not be finally appointed to the Public Service unless and until his probation shall have furnished to the Head of his Department satisfactory proof of his fitness.

2. If it should be considered necessary or desirable on medical grounds and in the case of scientific officers on medical or scientific grounds the period of probation may be further extended at the discretion of the Head of his Department, such extension not to exceed four years in the case of extension on medical grounds or two years in the case of extension on scientific grounds.

3. These Regulations shall be applicable to the classes of Civil Servants to whom the provisions of Article 6 of the said Order in Council of the 10th day of January 1910 applied and shall come into force forthwith.

4. The Regulations dated the 2nd day of November 1944 made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the said Order of the 22nd day of July 1920 and Article 6 of the said Order in Council of the 10th day of January 1910 thereby repealed are and remain repealed respectively and these Regulations are hereby substituted for the said Regulations dated the 2nd day of November 1944 and Article 6 of the said Order in Council of the 10th day of January 1910.
