RUBBER MANUFACTURING WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be :

(a) To provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road from a point on the road from Rosehearty, in the County of Banff (B.9031), to the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road near Macduff, approximately 80 yards east of its junction with the said Trunk Road to a point on the said Trunk Road approximately 30 yards south east of the said junction;

(b) to provide for the stopping up entirely of the existing junction between the said road from Rosehearty and the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road on its eastern side when the new road is completed;

(c) that Section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1936 (which modifies the Restriction of Ribbon Development Act, 1935, in its application to trunk roads), will apply to the new road on the date when the order comes into force.

(d) that the Banff County Council will become the highway authority for the new road on the sixteenth day of May next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and the plan showing the line of the new road may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of three months from

25th January 1947 at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, or at the offices of the Banff County Council, County Offices, Banff, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, 21 Castle Terrace, Edinburgh, 1.

Any person may, within the said period of three months from 25th January 1947, object to the making of the Order by notice to the Minister addressed to Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.
