CONSTRUCTIONAL SCHEME No. 12.
GLEN SHIRA PROJECT.
SHIRA TRANSMISSION LINES.

THE Electricity Commissioners have approved a Constructional Scheme prepared by the North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board in accordance with Section 5 of the Hydro-Electric Development (Scotland) Act, 1943, providing for the construction of Works the situations of which are shown in Part I. of the Schedule hereto, and for the acquisition of the lands and wayleaves specified in Part II. of the said Schedule.

The Scheme has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for confirmation.

PART I.—WORKS.

(A) HYDRO-ELECTRIC GENERATION WORKS IN THE COUNTY OF ARGYLL.

Work No. 1.—A Reservoir in the Parish of Inveraray and Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail to be formed by a dam across the River Shira near the cottage of Sron Mor.

Work No. 2.—A Reservoir in the Parish of Inveraray and the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail to be formed by a dam across the River Shira at a point 1500 yards or thereby measured in a southerly direction from the cottage of Sron Mor.

Work No. 3.—An Aqueduct in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail.

Work No. 4.—An Aqueduct commencing in the Parish of Lochgilhead and Kilmorich and terminating in the Reservoir (Work No. 1).

Work No. 5 (a).—An Aqueduct commencing in the Parish of Lochgilhead and Kilmorich and terminating in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail in the Allt an Taillir.

(b).—An Aqueduct in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail and terminating in Aqueduct (Work No. 5 (a)).

Works Nos. 6 and 7.—Aqueducts in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail.

Works Nos. 8, 9, and 10.—Aqueducts in the Parish of Inveraray.

Work No. 11 (a).—An Aqueduct in the Parish of Inveraray.

(b).—An Aqueduct in the Parish of Lochgilhead and Kilmorich.

Work No. 12.—A Generating Station in the Parish of Lochgilhead and Kilmorich at a point 500 yards or thereby measured in a south-westerly direction from the Farm of Clachan on the public road from Inveraray to Arrochar and including a tail race to Loch Fyne.

Work No. 13.—A Generating Station in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail at a point 200 yards or thereby measured in a southerly direction from the cottage of Sron Mor.

Work No. 14.—An Aqueduct line or lines of pipes in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail.

Work No. 15.—A raising in the Parish of Lochgilhead and Kilmorich of the public road from Inveraray to Arrochar.

(B) ELECTRICITY TRANSMISSION WORKS.

Main Transmission Lines as delineated in red on the Map accompanying the Scheme.

(a) Three-phase lines above or below ground designed for operation at 11,000 volts between phases, commencing in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail at the Generating Station (Work No. 13) and terminating in the Parish of Lochgilhead and Kilmorich at the Generating Station (Work No. 12).

(b) Three-phase overhead lines designed for operation at 132,000 volts between phases with one line of towers commencing at the Generating Station (Work No. 12) and terminating at Inverglas in the Parish of Arrochar.

PART II.—LANDS AND WAYLEAVES.

(A) FOR THE HYDRO-ELECTRIC GENERATION WORKS.
