The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Clackmannan, Fife, Lanark. Midlothian, Peebles, and Stirling.

Work No. 1.—A Reservoir in the Parish of Inveraray and Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail to be formed by a dam across the River Shira near the cottage of Sron Mor.

Work No. 2.- A Reservoir in the Parish of Inveraray and the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail to be formed by a dam across the River Shira at a point 1500 yards or thereby measured in a southerly direction from the cottage of Sron Mor.

Work No. 3 .- An Aqueduct in the Parish of Glenorchy and Inishail.

Work No. 4.—An Aqueduct commencing in the Parish of cochgoilhead and Kilmorich and terminating in the Reservoir (Work No. 1) .

Work No. 5 (a).—An Aqueduct commencing in the Parish of Lochgoilhead and Kilmorich and terminating in the Parish

of Glenorchy and Inishail in the Allt an Taillir.
